New licenses for 2009: As you know, your fishing license is good until April 1 this year. When you buy your new license (I get a combination hunting and fishing license), consider also purchasing a DUCK STAMP. Why a duck stamp you ask?

You don't have to be a waterfowl hunter to buy a Duck Stamp. Hunters and non-hunters alike buy the stamp for hunting and to support habitat conservation in America. Keep in mind that the purchase of wetlands and other habitat through this program benefit all aspects of wildlife, including upland game birds.
